A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR LINDSAY SMILING

Myths posit what is good or bad, where we come from, who has authority, what is our origin, why the world is the way it is, or point to some truth of the nature of existence. We see gods in The Half-God of Rainfall lusting after and manipulating the mortals. We see hierarchy amongst both mortal and gods. We see a male-dominated society that makes heroes out of our sports figures. Central to the journey of this poem are questions of how to confront the structures of inequality in society. Do you keep working at change? Do you tear everything down? How do you break cycles of trauma? When is enough, enough? When is vengeance necessary? In the grand scheme of things, do your choices even matter? All these questions feel immediate. We are closely examining our institutions. We are looking at our governing structures with added scrutiny. We are looking at our difficulties. We are trying to reimagine our possibilities. The Half-God of Rainfall offers to "Play with love. Play with pain." In the face of so much dissatisfaction with the world I find this offering full of hope. It feels like a message coming from both the past and the future while honoring the magnitude of the difficulties we are facing. How exactly do we hold both love and pain as we fight brutality, violence, and abuse is the next question. One we must work on collectively. And as we do so, it is certain that some myths must die.

MEET OUR COMMUNITY PARTNER

Meet **The Accessible Productions Initiative (API)**, a new program at the Wilma generously funded by the William Penn Foundation. In the Community Practice Department, we believe that pulling inspiration from a variety of voices creates the most authentic artistic experience. We seek to demystify the creative process and add community perspective and wisdom. API invites partner organizations into a production's process to observe and share their reflections with the creative team. Then, we work with the partner organization to create engaging supplemental materials and creative responses to the play, which are shared with our broader audience.

For *The Half-God of Rainfall*, our Community Partner is the **Masculinity Action Project (MAP)**. MAP's work is centered around unlearning Toxic Masculinity and channeling that energy into collective action in support of gender justice and creating new versions of masculinity.



MAP joined a special session with the cast, sharing a lesson plan about Power and Patriarchy. This plan was also shared with Wilma teaching artists to use as part of this year's Wilmagination residency work, which centers on *Half-God*, in 11 classrooms throughout Philadelphia. Additionally, MAP members created a podcast series and a music EP based on themes from the show which will be shared throughout February. We hope that these materials will provide a way to meet the play and sit more deeply with its questions.

MAP's work has been woven into the entire ecosystem of the Education & Community Practice Department this winter and we are proud to work in such a deep and integrated way. Thank you for being at the theater tonight. Thank you for believing in the power of community collaborations.
